English

In IntitilLit, receptions have been continuing to learn new sounds and have been practicing decoding and encoding words to read and write sentences. They have started reading and writing tricky words.

Year 1s have been learning new spelling rules and have been practicing the following digraphs and trigraphs 'ge', 'dge', 'tch' They have also been practicing adding prefixes to words, including the new prefix -un.

Students are continuing to practice their spl ,it digraphs. Each morning year 1's are practicing their look, cover and write skills using their tricky words.

In Writing, we have been learning about information reports and how we can gather and display factual information. We have been learning about the difference between fact, fiction, and opinion. Students are working towards creating information reports about an animal.

Our oral language focuses this term is on the text type Information Reports. Students have been practicing sharing and discuss different topics.

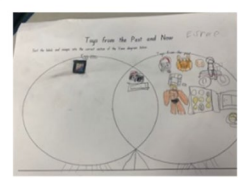


Maths
